















This document provides useful visa information on travel to Nepal for the 5th Annual Feed the Future Innovation Lab for Nutrition (Nutrition Innovation Lab) Agriculture-Nutrition Scientific Symposium and 2nd Agriculture, Nutrition and Health (ANH) Academy week going to be held on 9-13 July 2017 in Kathmandu, **Nepal**. You need to obtain a tourist visa if you plan to attend the event and you are not from Nepal or India. The process of obtaining a tourist visa is outlined below.

Eligibility and Duration

Tourists visiting Nepal are eligible for the Tourist Visa on Arrival at the port of entry. However, tourists holding a passport of the following countries are not eligible for on arrival visa at the port of entry: Nigeria, Ghana, Zimbabwe, Swaziland, Cameroon, Somalia, Liberia, Ethiopia, Iraq, Afghanistan and Palestine.

Application Process

Application for the Visa should be submitted to the Immigration Officer at the port of entry or Diplomatic Missions or Consuls of Nepal aboard (for a list click here). Please bring two passport-size photographs if you want a visa at the port of entry. The conference is happy to provide a letter if necessary to support participants' visa application.

Citizens of the countries listed above must apply for a visa to Nepal in person at the nearest consulate of Nepal. If there is no consulate of Nepal in the countries listed above, there may be a consulate of Nepal in a neighboring country that covers the jurisdiction. Please note, application procedures and fees may vary by location.

Fee structure:

Visa Fee for a single-entry visa

a) US\$ 25 for 15 days Visa

Validity of your passport

All travelers will need a passport, valid for at least 90 days following your departure date. However, it is strongly recommended that travelers' passports are valid for 6 months to be issued a visa. It is also recommended that your passport have at least two un-used pages remaining, for any necessary entry and exit stamps that may be issued. It is also a good idea to review the number of pages and validity remaining your passport well in advance of travel. This will allow for time needed if a replacement passport may be required.
