

ANH2019 POSTER PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

Congratulations on being selected to give a poster presentation at the 4th Annual Agriculture, Nutrition & Health Academy Week research conference at the Westin Hyderabad Mindspace from June 24-28, 2019, in Hyderabad, India! Please read these guidelines carefully. They have been prepared to help you prepare and present a strong and effective poster. Questions? Please contact ANH-Academy@lshtm.ac.uk.

FORMAT

Abstracts selected for poster presentation at the ANH Academy will be displayed throughout the three-day conference, with poster viewing sessions built into the programme so you can discuss your research with ANH2019 attendees.

In addition to the traditional poster viewing sessions, poster presenters will participate in a one-minute mini-poster presentation in plenary during the conference. Each presenter will be allotted one minute and one PowerPoint slide to draw attention to their findings. This is an opportunity to think creatively and strategically about how to summarize your research in only one minute and in a single slide. Consider what single image or result represents a compelling aspect of your research or summarises the main findings. You can also think of the one-minute presentation as a way to capture the audience's attention and encourage them to visit your poster and learn more. A prize, based on popular vote, will be awarded for the best poster presentation at ANH2019.

INSTRUCTIONS

Speaker profile: The programme for ANH2019 is hosted through the official event app, through which a basic profile for all speakers has been set up. We now invite you to populate your speaker profile with your information. Instructions have been sent in an email to you. If you have not received this please first check your junk mail box. If it is not there please get in touch via ANH-Academy@lshtm.ac.uk.

Timing: Please check the ANH2019 programme for the poster viewing session times. You should be standing near your poster during those times to interact with attendees and answer questions. There are two plenary sessions for the one-minute presentations. Your assigned session will be emailed to you by Wednesday 19 June. Please arrive in the plenary room for your designated session at least 10 minutes prior to the start to find your assigned seat.

Poster display: Please bring your printed poster with you to ANH2019 to set-up. You are responsible for setting up your poster for display in the poster room. Posters will be mounted using thumbtacks which will be available on site. The ANH Academy organizing team will be on hand to assist with set-up. Unfortunately, the ANH Academy organizing team cannot assist with local printing arrangements.

Poster specifications: For the physical poster, please follow these guidelines.

- Please use PowerPoint to format the contents of your poster. Poster dimensions are to be 121.92 cm by 91.44 cm (48 inches by 36 inches). Basic poster presentation templates can be found [here](#) and [here](#).
- The poster should have a title at the top, including the list of authors. Lettering in the title should be at least 2.54 cm (1 inch) to ensure legibility.
- To ensure legibility and clarity throughout the remainder of the poster, please ensure that fonts are at least 28 point. We encourage inclusion of figures, tables, photographs, charts, and infographics as necessary. Please ensure that visuals are well labelled, large enough, and do not overcrowd the poster with information.

One-minute slide specifications: For the one-minute presentation, please prepare one slide in PowerPoint. Do not use a font size smaller than 20 for text; a font size of 28 or 32 is easier to see from the back of a large room. All presentations must run on the Windows operating system. Presentations will be projected in 4:3 format.

Submission: Please upload your single slide no later than **Sunday 23 June** via your speaker profile.

Please note that the organizing committee shall not be held responsible for any technical issues occurring due to late communication.

Tips on poster content

For a research paper presentation, be sure to include:

- Background, i.e., the problem/issue addressed;
- Aims, i.e., the study's importance and relevance, and major hypotheses;
- Study design and methodology; and
- Main results, interpretations, and conclusions that link to agriculture, food system linkages to nutrition and/or health.

For a programme description/evaluation presentation, be sure to include:

- Problem or issue addressed by the program;
- Programme objectives;
- Theoretical or conceptual framework;
- Programme design or description of implementation;
- Outcome and/or process evaluation methods and results; and
- Programme implications.
